

Setting Up The Jim Rome Podcast for iTunes 7

System Requirements: Microsoft Windows (2000 or XP) or Mac OS X with iTunes 7 installed. iPod for mobile MP3 playback. Note: Microsoft Windows Vista is not fully supported with current version of iTunes 7, see below FAQ section for more details.

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

Before using the “Jim Rome Podcast” for iTunes 7, you must uninstall the Jungle Media Center automatic MP3 download software from your computer.

TO UNINSTALL THE JUNGLE MEDIA CENTER:

PC

- Click on the Start Menu.
- Select Settings, and then select Control Panel.
- Click Add or Remove Programs.
- Select the Jungle Media Center program.
- Click the Remove button.

Mac

- Move the Jungle Media Center program (located in the Macintosh HD/Applications folder) to the trash folder.
- Move the Jungle Media Center folder (located in the Macintosh HD/Users/{user}/Library/Applications Support folder) to the trash folder.
- Empty the trash folder to permanently remove the Jungle Media Center from your computer.

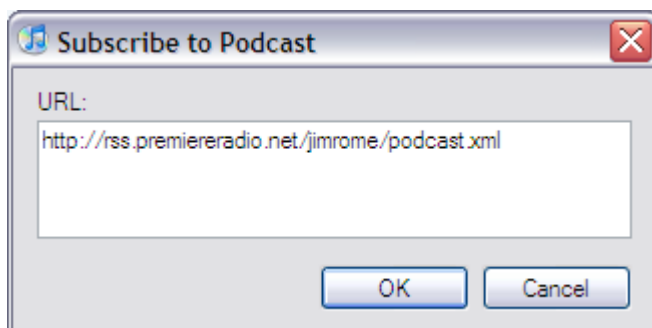
- If needed, download and install iTunes 7 for PC or Mac from:
www.apple.com/itunes
- Once installed, launch iTunes 7 and proceed through the normal setup.
- Go to: <http://www.jimrome.com/home/jungle/podcast.html>
(Be sure you are logged into the website with your Jim Rome Streamlink username & password)
- Click this link → Add Jim Rome Podcast to iTunes
- This will bring up iTunes and auto-load the Jim Rome Podcast feed to the Podcast section of iTunes.

If auto-load does not occur:

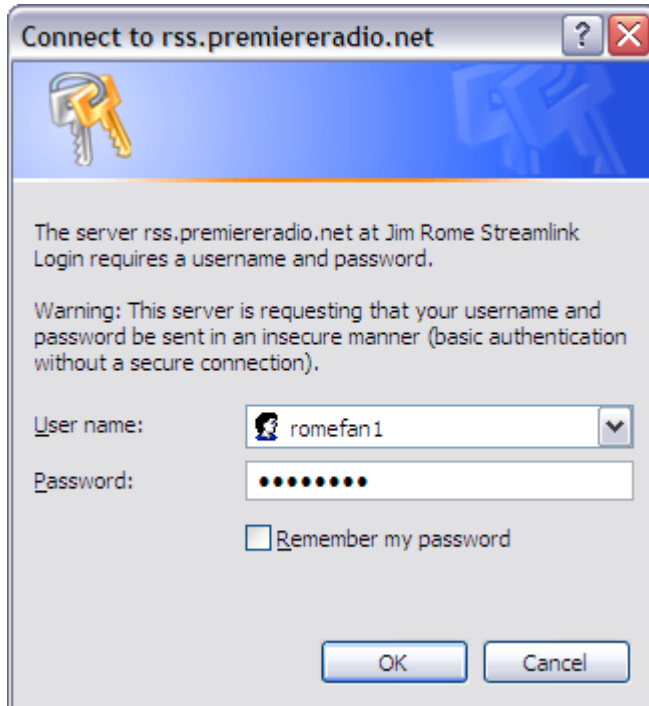
Within the iTunes player, go to the “Advanced” menu and select “Subscribe to Podcast...”
In the Subscribe to Podcast box, paste the below URL:

<http://rss.premiereradio.net/jimrome/podcast.xml>

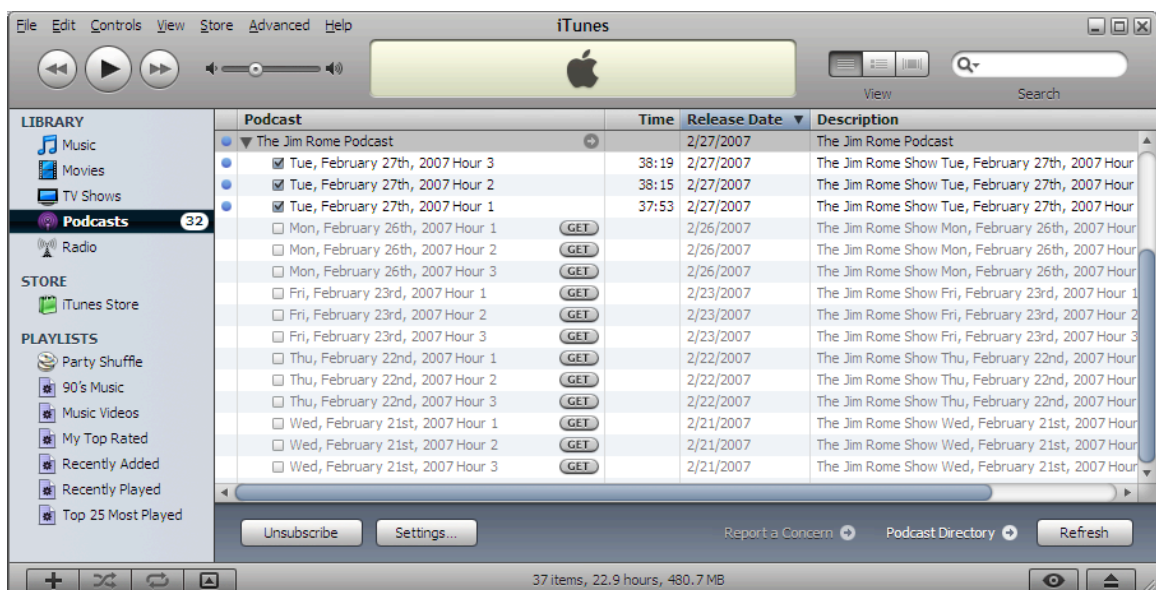
Click OK.



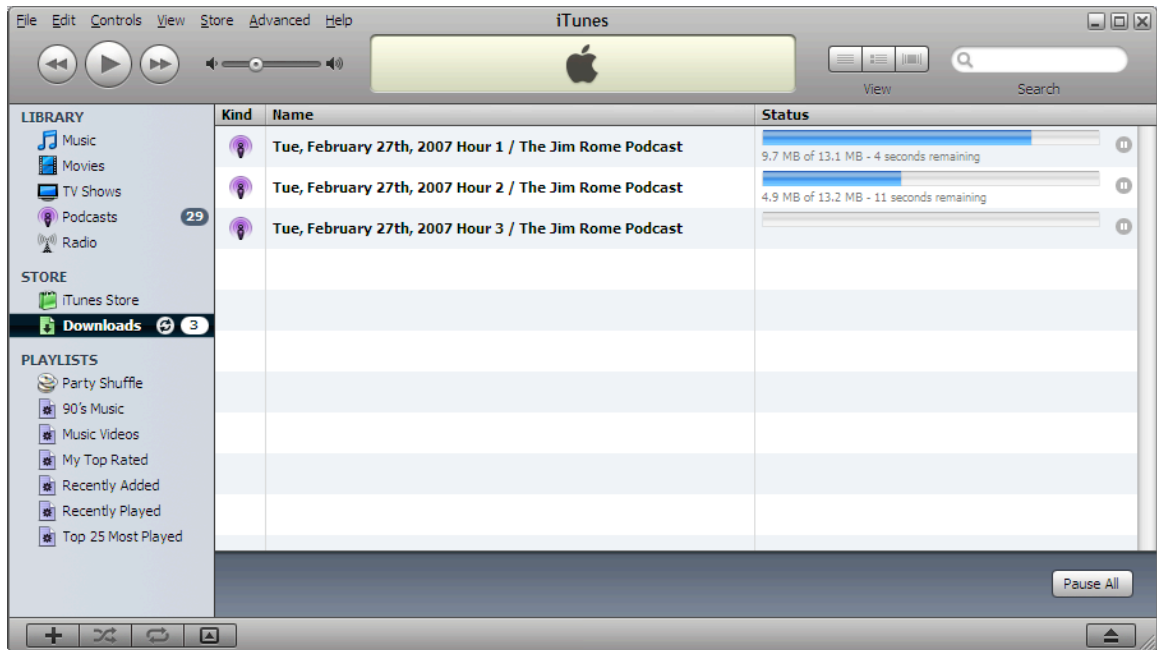
- When prompted within iTunes, enter your Streamlink username & password.
(Be sure to checkmark "Remember my password")
Note: PC users will be required to click the OK button for the username / password box each time iTunes is restarted.



- You will see the Jim Rome Podcast in the main window of iTunes.
(If you don't see it, click the Podcasts icon in the left menu bar of iTunes 7.)
- Click the small dark grey **triangle** next to the feed to reveal the available shows for download.

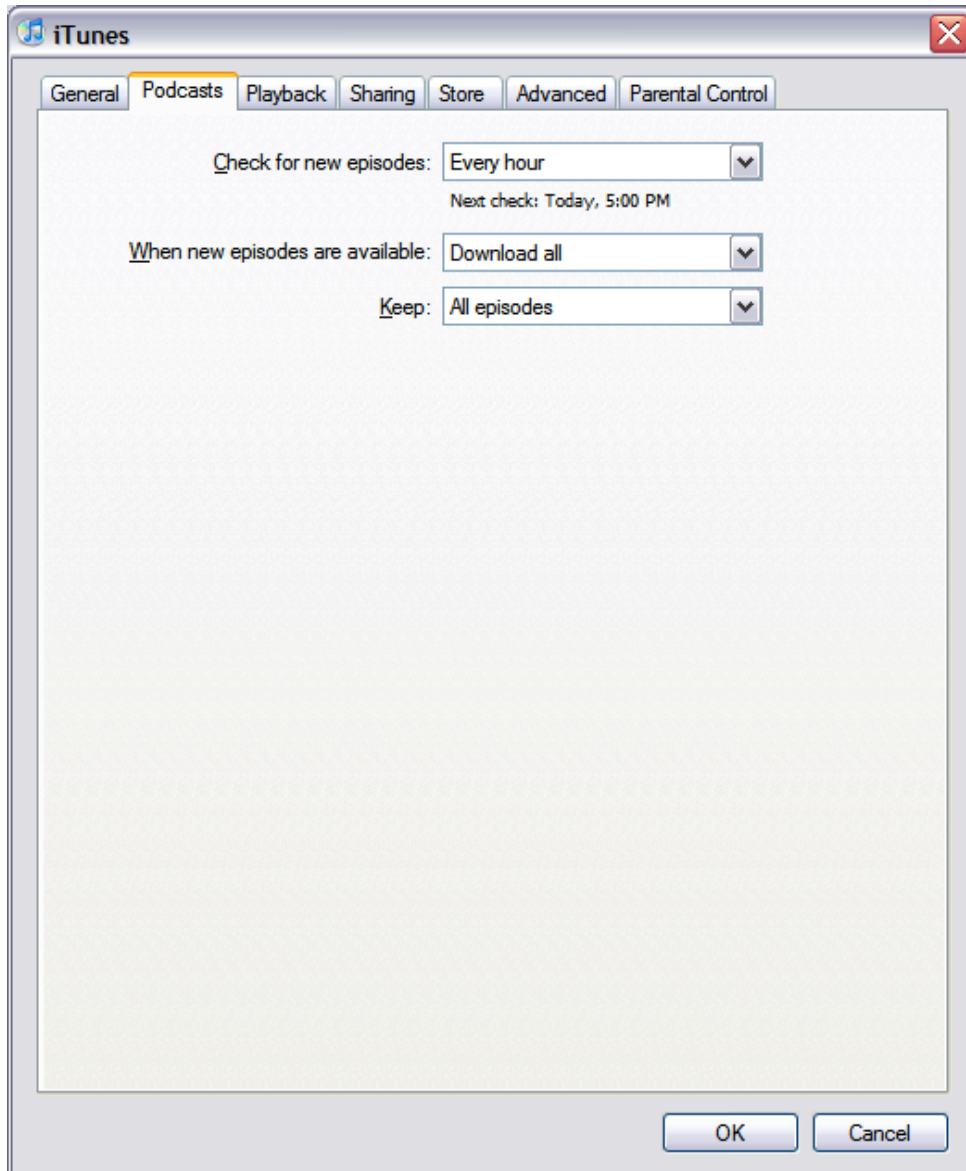


- Click the **GET** button next to each MP3 hour or Video Update MP4 that you wish to manually download.
(Once fully downloaded, the grey text description will become a dark black)
- To monitor the progress of the download, click the Downloads icon in the left menu bar of iTunes 7.



Setting Up The Jim Rome Podcast for Auto-Download

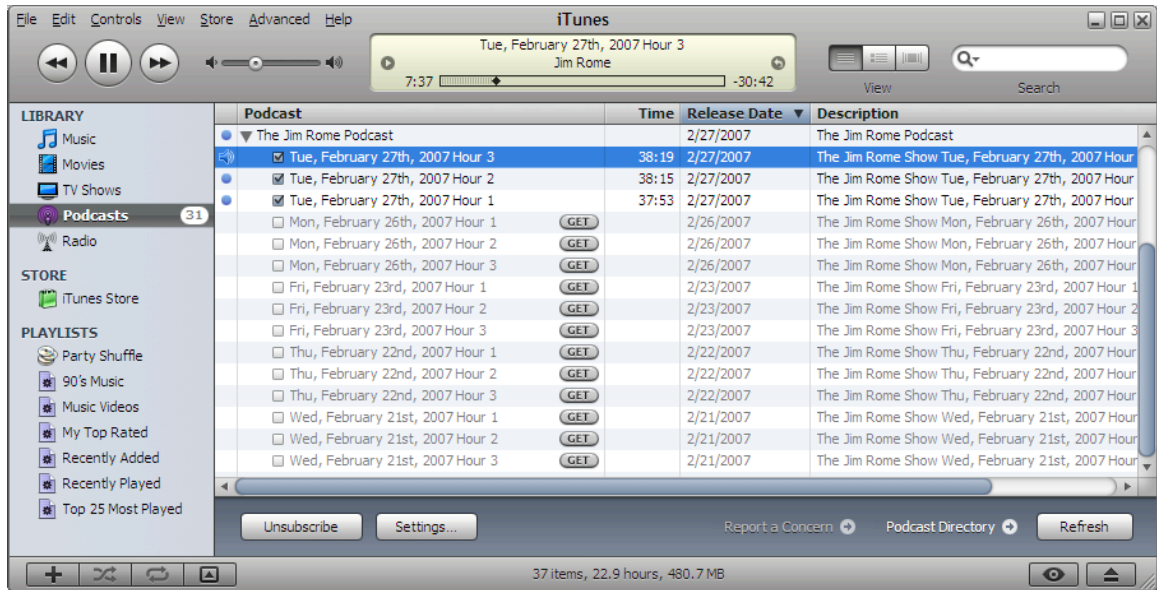
- Open iTunes Preferences:
PC: **Edit Menu > Preferences**
Mac: **iTunes Menu > Preferences**
- Click the **Podcasts** tab in the newly opened window
- Set the following:
Check for new episodes: **Every Hour**
** Note the next check time underneath indicates the next scheduled check.*
When new episodes are available: **Download all**
** This insures download of all hours and morning updates that are new.*
Keep: **All episodes**
** You may manually delete older shows at your convenience.*
- Click the **OK** button.



Playback of the Jim Rome Podcast in iTunes 7

- To play the audio podcast in iTunes, simply double-click on the file of choice to hear it. Alternatively, you may simply highlight the hour of choice by clicking on it once and then clicking the play button in the upper left hand corner of iTunes.

Note: If you do not hear any audio, be sure the volume bar in iTunes is adjusted to the right or make sure your computer speakers are on.



Synching the Jim Rome Podcast to your iPod

- Attach your iPod to your computer using the supplied USB cable.
- Click the **iPod** icon in the left menu bar of iTunes 7.



- Click the **Podcasts** tab in the main window.

- Checkmark **Sync all episodes** or **Jim Rome Podcast**.
- Click the **Apply** button.
- Click the **File** menu and select “**Sync iPod**” to transfer the files from iTunes to your iPod.
- When ready to detach the iPod and listen on-the-go, click the **Eject** icon next to the **iPod** icon in the left side menu bar in iTunes 7.



Playback of the Jim Rome Podcast on the iPod

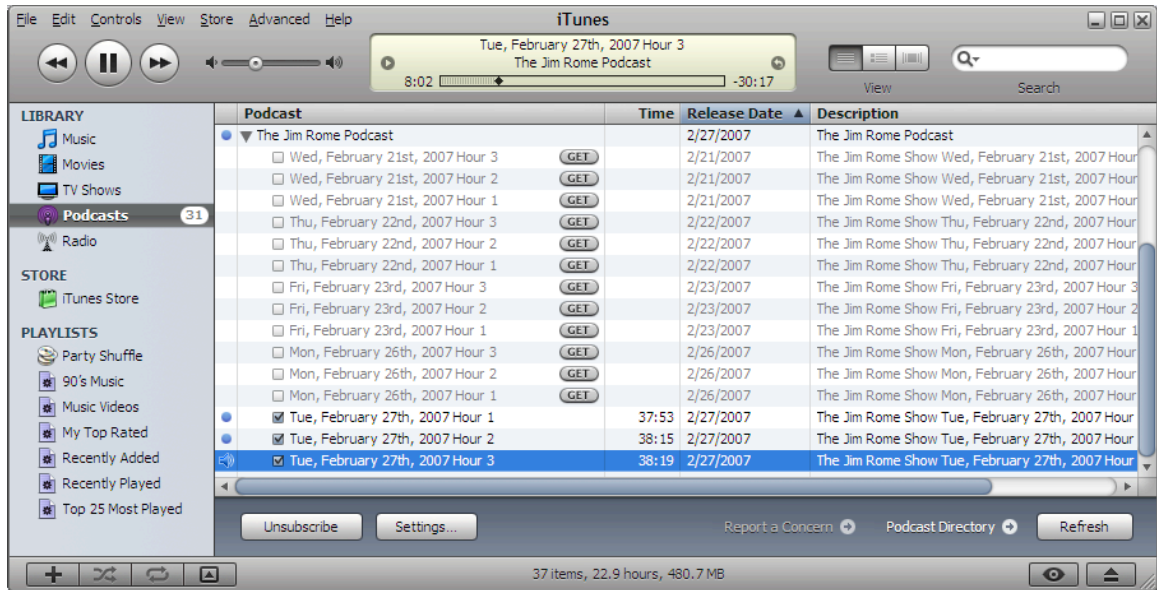
- To playback the Jim Rome Podcast audio on your iPod, navigate to: Music → Podcasts → Jim Rome Podcast → (Podcast Hours)
- Scroll to the hour of choice and then click the center button to play.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Listing Order of the Jim Rome Podcast

You can control way iTunes categorizes the order of your items by Podcast, Time, Release Date or Description.

You can easily reverse the order dates of the downloaded the Jim Rome Podcast Hours by clicking the Release Date tab in the iTunes Podcast category.



Within the iPod however, it lists in chronological order by date and hour. You can create your own playlist in iTunes and arrange them in the order you wish to hear the show and then sync to your iPod.

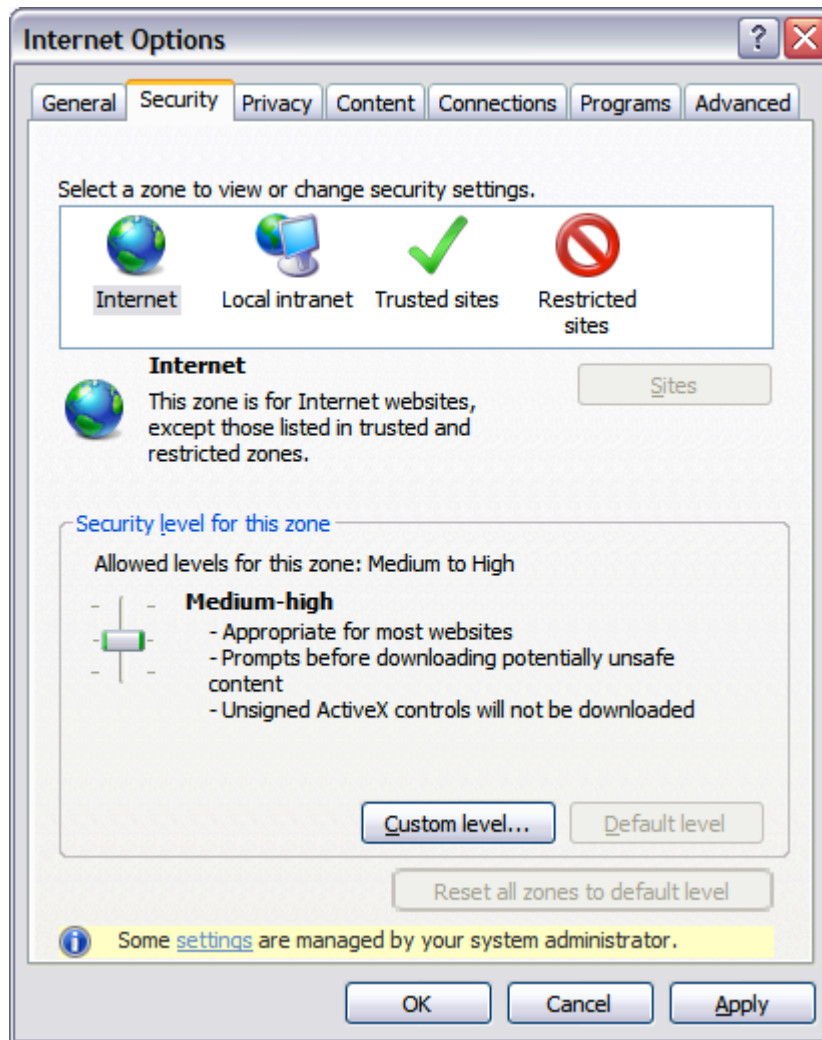
Note: In the iPod, after you have completed playback of any given hour in the Podcast category, the iPod will take you back to the main Podcast menu. This is normal.

iTunes Most Current Version, Still Not Prompted For Password

If iTunes is at the most current update and you are still not being prompted for a username / password, this is likely a result of an Internet Explorer security setting which iTunes uses for its username & password authentication.

- To correct:
- Open Internet Explorer.
- Go to: Tools > Internet Options > Security Tab
- Select Default Level
- Click Apply
- Click OK
- Try again in iTunes.



- Mac users, insure that Port 8080 is not being blocked by any network firewall.

*****Exclamation Point Alert Next to Jim Rome Podcast Feed / No New Podcasts Downloaded *****

If you have downloaded but not listened to the Jim Rome Podcast in iTunes for more than 5 days, iTunes will automatically stop downloading the Jim Rome Podcast.

- To correct:
- Click the ! button next to the feed.
- When asked to resume this podcast, click the **Yes** button.
